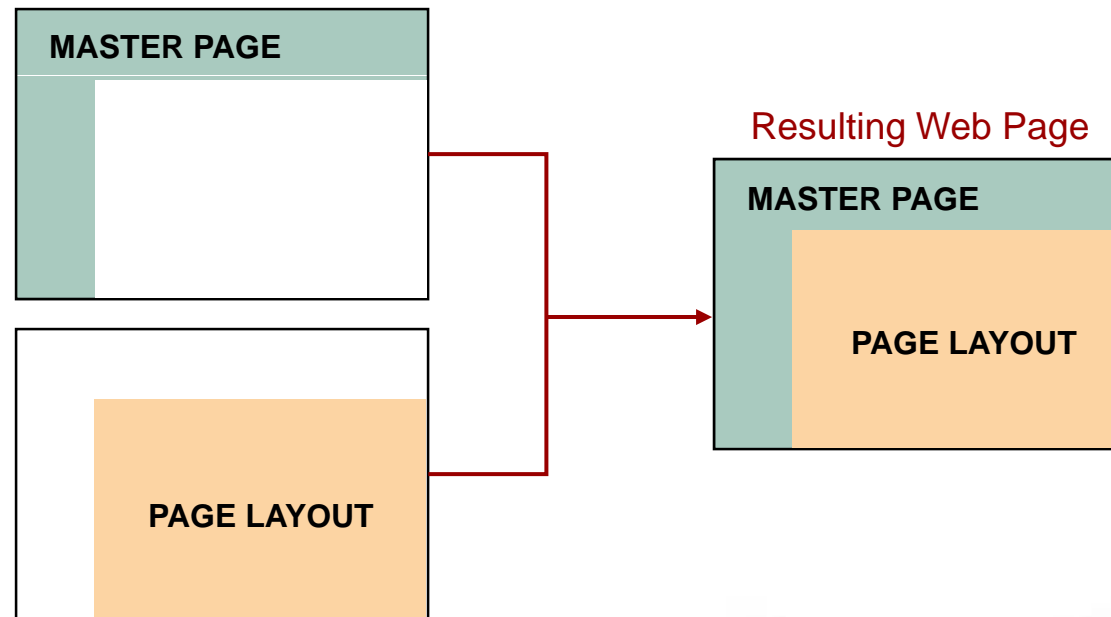

# MOSS Web Page

After creating a master page and a page layout in MOSS, you can use them to build out pages in the website.



# Creating a Web Page

1. Go to the root site or subsite where you want to create a page.
2. Go to *Site Actions > Create Page*
3. Fill in the **Title**, **Description**, and **URL Name** (file name) for the page.

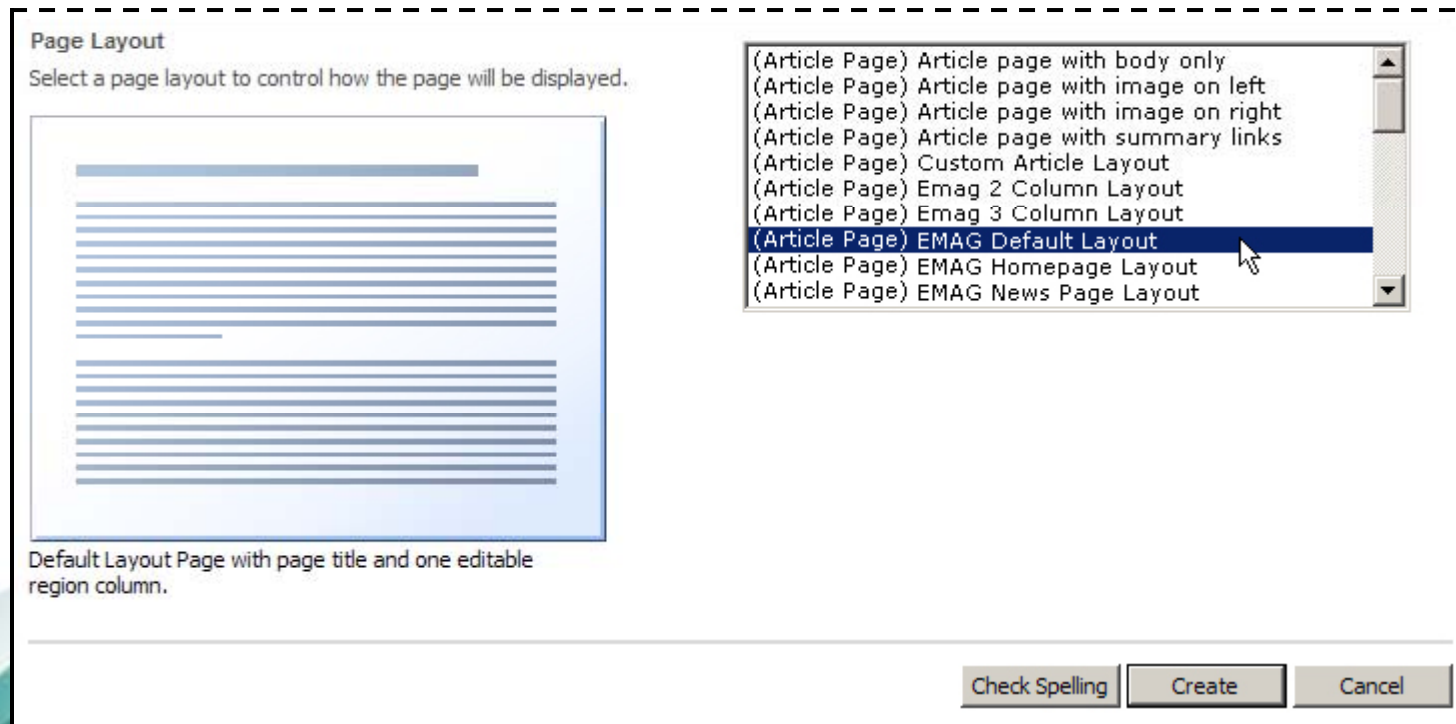

# Creating a Web Page

4. Choose the **Page Layout** that you would like to use for your web page. The Page Layout list contains default MOSS layouts as well as your custom layouts.
5. Click **Create** to save your new page.



# Setting the Welcome Page

In MOSS, the home page (landing page) of each site and subsite is known as the **Welcome Page**.

In most cases, you want to control the look and feel of the Welcome Page for each site and subsite. After you create a web page based on your custom page layout, you can set that page as the Welcome Page.

1. Navigate to the desired site or subsite.
2. Go to *Site Actions > Site Settings > Look and Feel > Welcome Page*
3. Browse to the page that you want to use as the Welcome Page.
4. Click *OK*.
5. Now when someone visits the root of the site (or subsite), it will redirect to your Welcome Page.
